Now, more importantly: Over the years some parishes sent multiple students to the Glen.

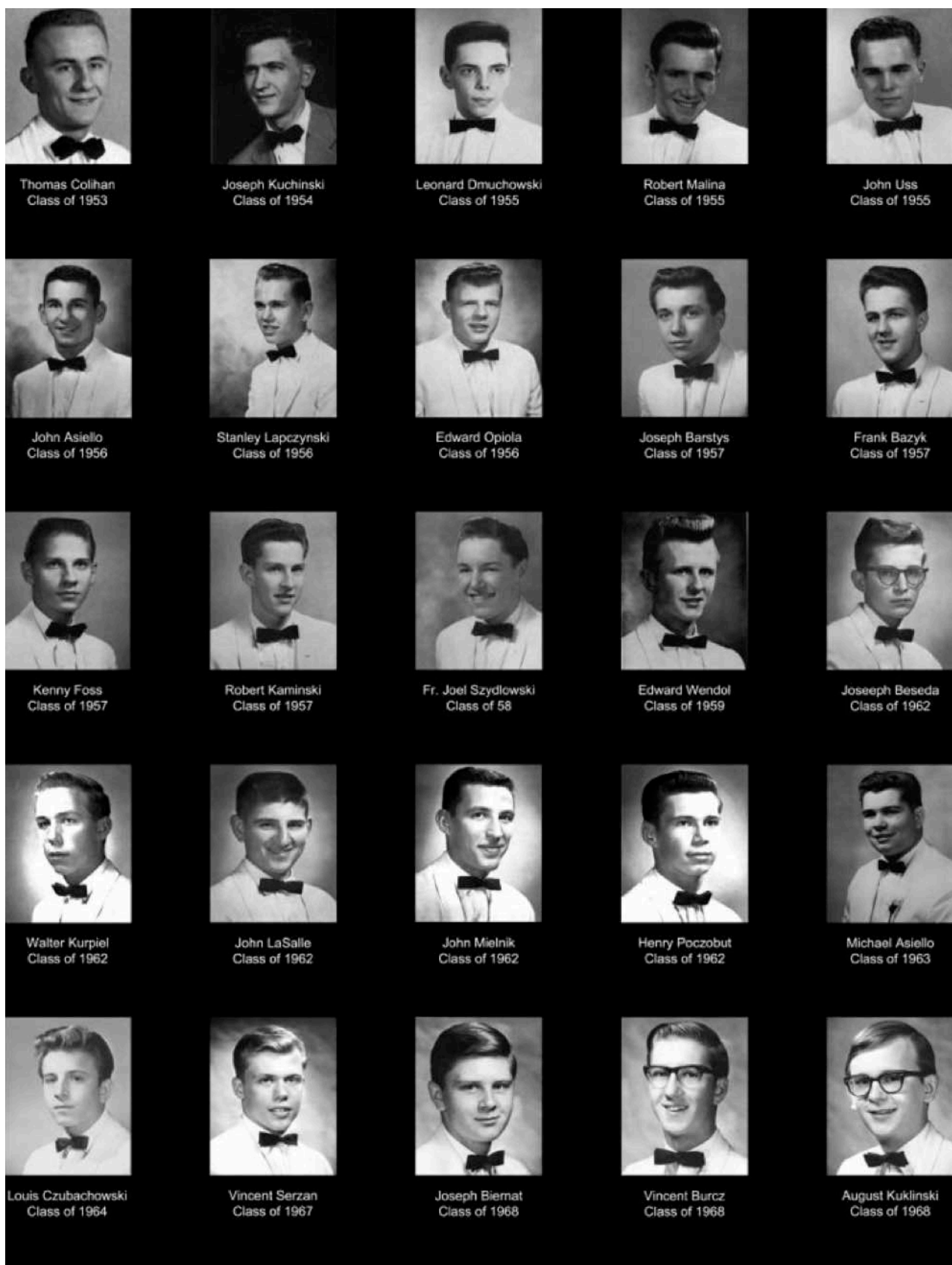

Class of '53

Richard Julian Chodnicki, age 82, passed away unexpectedly at his home in Mohegan Lake, N.Y. on July 15, 2017 with his wife and daughter at his side. He is the son of the late Ambrose and Joanna (Siemaszko) Chodnicki from Duryea, PA. He was the youngest of 9 children and was preceded in death by 6 of them - his oldest sister Wanda Orloski and his brothers Ambrose (who died in WWII), Joseph, John, Reverend Francis, and Raymond. He was married to MaryAnn Walling from Plains, PA 56 years ago in May. They have 3 children - daughters Cheryl (Kelly) Lowman and Lori (Jason) Kavanaugh, son Lt. Colonel Joseph Chodnicki and 4 grandchildren - Samantha and Sarah Lowman and Sebastian and Abigail Kavanaugh. Two sisters also survive - Sabina Krymowski from Cleveland Ohio and Dorothy Russick from New Castle, PA. He graduated from Padua High School in 1953 in their pioneer class. He then went on to study at the University of Scranton and graduated with a B.S. in 1958. He participated in the R.O.T.C. while attending the University and after graduation he served two years at Fort Belvoir in Virginia entering as a second lieutenant and finishing as a first Lieutenant. He then got a job at IBM in Endicott, N.Y. and eventually transferred to Poughkeepsie where he worked for many years before taking an early retirement so he and his wife could enjoy time with family as well as enjoy travel especially cruises to the various islands. His jokes and his love for his Polish heritage will be missed by his many nieces and nephews.
