

Everything was made by the young owner who learned the recipes from a Polish neighbor (from Poland, of course).

Saturday evening Mass was celebrated by Fr. Joel Szydlowski, OFM (Class of '58). Stan Ostaszewski delivered a brief reflection after communion on his late brother, Alexander, who was a member of the Class of '64 and an outstanding gymnast.
